<u>HISTORY</u>

Situated on Main Street in New Iberia, is the Historic Evangeline Theater and Bayou Teche Museum. The original building was constructed before 1870. In 1930, The Theodore Sliman Family opened the Evangeline Theater. In 1937 Kalil Sliman bought the Fur Company and created The Sports Center Bar. The Bar closed in the 1990's. The City of New Iberia purchased the Bar in 2002. Between 2002 and 2009, the City renovated the building and designed exhibits for a museum. The Bayou Teche Museum was opened to the public in 2010.
