

Investigation Summary Report

Robin Plantation Arnaudville, LA.





HISTORY

The Robin House was built in the early 1800's. According to the care taker it once sat across the Teche until it was moved in 1812 by barge to its current location. The St. Martin House once sat on the 300 block of St. Martin St. in St. Martinville, LA. It was relocated to the Robin Plantation along with another old home from Washington, LA. The Robin family lived in the home until 1925. It is noteworthy because of its Bousillage construction. This was once the normal in rural French construction. It is one of the relatively few surviving French Creole houses in the parish.

EXPERIENCES

The care taker and family members that once lived in the home state there is unexplained activity on the property and home. There are several reports of an older gentleman that has been seen in a rocker and in the attic. There are reports of a light being seen numerous times in the attic. (Note: there is no electricity to this home). Several people claim to have seen a little girl in the house and property.

The team and class members experienced several unusual occurrences during both investigations. Several people were touched including the care taker who had to step outside for a while. Some felt and followed cold spots in the St. Martin House. A shadow was seen by two investigators in the Robin House. A figure was followed with the thermal camera in the attic of the Robin House before snapping the picture. Several loud knocks in response to speaking French and asking to please know on something. Sounds of walking up in the attic were heard by several people. A team member witnessed a shadow moving behind the house and as he approached it was gone. Boo Belle was activated numerous times in the attic.

Investigators Reports

Location: Robin Plantation

Date: January 28th and February 25th

Investigators: The Acadiana Chapter and Class

Equipment used: digital voice recorders, motion light up balls, rem pods, Boo Belle Rem Pod Trigger Object, K2, cameras, thermal camera, full spectrum camera and night vision binoculars.

While doing the walkthrough we also took pictures. After the walkthrough we proceeded to investigate by breaking into groups. We investigated the Robin House, St. Martin House and the barn.

Attached Files

Thermal: Followed a figure in the attic before snapping a picture. There is no electricity in the house to cause a thermal hit.

Video: Light up balls in a vacant room at St. Martin House. Light up ball in a vacant room in Robin House. Rem Pod going off upstairs at St Martin House.

EVP's: One of the care takers started to speak in French to attempt to get a response. After she speaks we all heard several knocks in a row. We did get several other EVP's but these were very faint.

Video: the barn door closing. Although there was a very slight breeze that night, this is the only time the door closed nearly all the way. The breeze was blowing against the open part of the door. Therefore, it was closing against the slight breeze.

CONCLUSION

Louisiana Spirits has pioneered so many reportedly active locations in the state. By not simply going off of haunted tales, we treat any location as the next potential active location. In some cases, we walk out empty-handed, other times we don't.

In regards to this location, we feel it has both intelligent and residual activity.
